

Space Launch Complex 40 (SLC-40) at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida. Liftoff is targeted for 11:20 p.m. ET, with backup opportunities available until 2:58 a.m. ET on Tuesday, November 28. If needed, additional opportunities are also available on Tuesday, November 28 starting at 11:00 p.m. ET.

A live webcast of this mission will begin on **X @SpaceX** about five minutes prior to liftoff. **Watch live**.


SpaceX is targeting Monday, November 27 for a Falcon 9 launch of 23 **Starlink** satellites to low-Earth orbit from

This is the 17th flight for the first stage booster supporting this mission, which previously launched GPS III Space

Vehicle 04, GPS III Space Vehicle 05, Inspiration4, Ax-1, Nilesat 301, OneWeb Launch 17, ARABSAT BADR-8, and nine Starlink missions. Following stage separation, the first stage will land on the Just Read the Instructions droneship, which will be stationed in the Atlantic Ocean.
