NROL-105 MISSION

On Friday, January 16 at 8:39 p.m. PT, Falcon 9 launched the **NROL-105** mission from Space Launch Complex 4E (SLC-4E) at Vandenberg Space Force Base in California.

There was the possibility that residents of Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, and Ventura counties may have heard **one or more sonic booms** during the launch, but what residents experienced depended on weather and other conditions.

This was the second flight for the first stage booster supporting this mission, which previously launched one Starlink mission. Following stage separation, the first stage landed on Landing Zone 4 (LZ-4) at Vandenberg Space Force Base.
