STARLINK MISSION

On Sunday, January 25 at 9:30 a.m. PT, Falcon 9 launched 25 [Starlink](#) satellites to low-Earth orbit from Space Launch Complex 4 East (SLC-4E) from Vandenberg Space Force Base in California.

This was the sixth flight for the first stage booster supporting this mission, which previously launched Sentinel-6B, Twilight, and now four Starlink missions. Following stage separation, the first stage landed on the Of Course I Still Love You droneship, which was stationed in the Pacific Ocean.

There was a possibility that residents of Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, and Ventura counties may have heard **one or more sonic booms** during the launch, but what residents experienced depended on weather and other conditions.
